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## President's Message

Today I am writing from Hilton Head, South Carolina. Two times a year, I travel with my husband to a business meeting. In the fall, we are somewhere in Germany; spring, somewhere in the United States. This time we are in Hilton Head, South Carolina. As I sit in my room writing this, I hear the waves crashing on the beach. Just an hour earlier, people were out on the beach with cameras taking photos of the sun rising to greet the earth. I have seen no gulls. There are these very large crows or ravens flying around hoping to catch our notice. The beach is white, hard packed and smooth. I keep trying to compare it to the California beaches of which I am so familiar. Their bluffs, golden sand, and sea birds running at the edge of the waves set them apart from this more ordered look. The west coast waves race purposefully, lifting and crashing against the shore in a determined manner. Here, the waves are more laid back and roll lazily onto the beach. There are two southern shores, one east, one west; both similar-- both different.

Isn't this the way we are with our weaving? We can choose the same structure time and again but by changing our choices in color and texture make a very different piece of cloth. Doubleweave, as a structure, allows us to implement our creative ideas by giving us two sets of warps to work within our weaving. What freedom! What challenges!

Weaving offers us so many possibilities with its various weave structures. We can choose a structure because of its pattern or perhaps we are focused on the texture of materials or the colors and choose a structure that highlights these aspects. Maybe, we are choosing a structure because it has special significance. Whatever our choice, it is ours alone. We make the decision of structure, pattern and color. While weaving we watch the design rise to meet us, take form and become the cloth we purposed to make--artistry in motion.

## Proposed By-Laws Change

TH&SG By-Law Change Announced at General Meeting on March 23, 2011. To be discussed and voted on at the next General Meeting on April 27, 2011.

The Current By-Law states:

### Article V: Duties of Officers

**Standards Committee Chairperson:** Shall preside over the Standards Committee meetings; shall attend Board meetings and act as a liaison between the Board and the committee.

### Article VI: Committees

**Article VI: Committees Standards:** Committee shall meet with any person who desires to be included in Guild-related activities of showing or selling work. The person must present a representative body of work to the Committee. The Committee can grant Juried Status to a member if the qualifications are met. The Standards Committee shall inspect and jury all work submitted for exhibition or sales under the Guild auspices, and shall promote a high level of design and craftsmanship

### Article V: Duties of Officers

#### Proposed bylaw change

**Standards Committee Chairperson:** Presides over the Standards Committee, maintains a current list of the Juried Status of Guild members, and is the committee's liaison to the Board.

### Article VI: Committees

#### Proposed bylaw change

**Standards:** The purpose of the committee is to encourage a high level of craftsmanship in fiber related skills. Members wishing to sell or exhibit items in a Guild-sponsored public event must have juried status. These requirements do not apply to guild "Show & Tell" or education events. Guidelines developed by the Guild's Study Groups provide the standards for evaluation of items.

A new exhibition in Arizona, ***A Turning Point: Navajo Weaving in the Late 20th Century***, features more than three dozen textiles that epitomize the gradual change that took place in Navajo weaving from the 1970s into the 1990s, as a traditional craft transformed to include name artists exploring new aesthetics and showing in urban galleries. Open to the public at the Heard Museum in Phoenix, Arizona, from February 5 through May 22, 2011, the exhibition draws from the renowned Santa Fe Collection, recently donated to the Heard by Dr. Charles and Linda Rimmer. Among the premier Navajo weavers represented are Barbara Ornelas and her aunt Margaret Yazzie; Ella Rose Perry; Sarah Paul Begay; Lilly Touchin; Genevieve Shirley; the late Elsie Wilson and her sister Sadie Curtis; Jason Harvey; Winnie James (aka Martha Smith); the late Larry Yazzie; and many other accomplished artists.
