## President's Message

Claire Campbell Park presented at today's General Meeting. Her topic was, "Creating with Reverence". In Claire's book by the same title, she says, "To create with reverence is to give life to values that magnify the soul." What wonderful words to remember. My question to you is, are you creating with reverence?

In my own work, I seem to worry more about what others think of my work than to give my own meaning to my work. Instead of defining what I want to express, I think about what I believe others would glean from my creation. Rather than being satisfied with the results, I am constantly worried it's not good enough. Who is my critic? Why me of course. Does my work express my values? If it does, then does it matter what others think about the piece? Since my work is more for myself (I do not sell) then the worry about what others think or believe about the piece must greatly diminish. But, does it? Why or why not?

As fiber artists, most of us create at home, away from others. We don't go to a weaving room with many other weavers and weave. We feel privileged to be able to have our own space but, is it really a wonderful privilege all of the time? To get together with others, share ideas, ask the difficult questions about why we create, for whom we create, and the process of creating is a wonderful example of an art community. Guilds help us bridge the gap between being alone with our art and basking in an encouraging environment filled with people who understand just what being an artist is all about. We are fortunate to be part of a caring, encouraging, educating guild.

## Please Note: A New Dues Structure

The dues for next year are going to be raised, per a majority vote of the general membership at the Guild Meeting. This increase is largely due to the difficult economic times which have greatly restricted our revenue flow while increasing our liabilities. The dues are currently \$30 for a general membership, \$45 for a family membership, \$15 for a student membership and the ½ year dues for new members are \$15. The dues for the 2011-2012 year are \$40 for general membership, \$20 for a student and \$20 for the ½ year membership for new members. The family membership has been eliminated.

The Guild wants to thank you, its members, for seeing the need for a rate increase and giving such great support for its passage.

Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 24, 25 and 26, 2011

**Doubleweave - Two Ways, Three Days:** During this workshop given by Tom Kniesly, students will learn about the differences between structural doubleweave and block pattern doubleweave. Instruction will include weaving two layers of plain weave (on 4 shaft floor looms) with a fold which opens like a book to reveal a double width fabric. Also, on 8 shaft floor or

tables looms, some will be weaving pattern blocks of double weave. You will see the magic of weaving a double thickness fabric with two alternating pattern blocks. Finishing techniques will be discussed for each project. Each participant will choose to weave either:

1) a doubleweave, double width, throw or blanket on a 4 shaft floor loom with 3 different pattern options. See *Handwoven* March/April 2010, page 30

2) or a doubleweave scarf with 2 blocks and a minimum of 3 to 5 colors.

A choice of 4 different drafts will be available prior to the workshop and looms are to be warped using your selected draft prior to the workshop.

Students will provide all their own yarns (8/2 tencel may be ordered thru The Mannings) and come to the workshop with their looms already warped according to their selected draft. **Level:** All (need to be able to warp your own loom according to a draft)

### **Standards Committee Report**

#### PROPOSED BYLAW AMENDMENT FOR STANDARDS

Two years ago the Standards Committee began updating and revising the focus of the jurying process and documentation of those members who have been juried. The committee began offering more feedback on member's work as well as recognition for the accomplishments of guild members. The categories for evaluation of skills now reflects study groups within the guild, although one does not need to be a member of a study group to seek juried status in the category. With these changes the bylaws

related to the Standards Committee require an update also. These bylaw changes were presented at the general meeting in November 2010. At that time no objections were raised regarding the bylaw changes for Standards. The Standards Committee requests that these amendments be submitted for your vote at the March guild meeting, March 23, 2011. The current and proposed bylaws for Standards are listed below. #### Article V: Duties of Officers

Current bylaws

**Standards Committee Chairperson:** Shall preside over the Standards Committee meetings; shall attend Board meetings and act as a liaison between the Board and the committee.

#### Proposed bylaw change

**Standards Committee Chairperson:** Presides over the Standards Committee, maintains a current list of the Juried Status of Guild members, and is the committee's liaison to the Board.

#### Article VI: Committees

Current bylaws

**Standards:** Committee shall meet with any person who desires to be included in Guild-related activities of showing or selling work. The person must present a representative body of work to the Committee. The Committee can grant Juried Status to a member if the qualifications are met. The Standards Committee shall inspect and jury all work submitted for exhibition or sales under the Guild auspices, and shall promote a high level of design and craftsmanship.

#### Proposed bylaw change

**Standards:** The purpose of the committee is to encourage a high level of craftsmanship in fiber related skills. Members wishing to participate in a Guild-sponsored public event must have juried status. Guidelines developed by the Guild's Study Groups provide the standards for evaluation of items.
